



ERASMUS POLICY STATEMENT

International cooperation at all levels is one of the school's high priority activities.

International relations are the subject of concentrated attention and constant effort. The foundation of these activities is the further development and improvement of academic relations, especially with European universities. This effort is based on the main postulates of the Bologna Declaration, which are the building of a "Europe of Knowledge" as a widely recognised and irreplaceable factor for social and human growth and as an indispensable component to consolidate and enrich the European citizenship, and promoting the importance of education to the growth and strengthening of stable democratic societies.

When selecting new partners, the school proceeds base on – in addition to the natural criteria of identical or very similar study fields – the size of potential partner, as it is becoming evident that foreign schools with a large number of students and teachers are not too interested in working with smaller schools. But the decisive criteria consist of becoming thoroughly acquainted with the given school's teaching as well as science and research activities, and the conviction that any future cooperation will be mutually beneficial.

From the geographical perspective, future cooperation will remain focused mainly on European university level institutions, although non-European universities are not being ruled out.

The most important goals of this cooperation include the exchange of students, exchange of teaching and administrative staff, participation in joint projects, joint organization of scientific meetings, and the joint publication of teaching and specialized texts.
